**CLUB KIDS INTO COMMUNITY LEADERS
CONTINUING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE**

OFFICER GARRETT

TEAM WORK. LEADERSHIP. BEING COMFORTABLE IN UNFAMILIAR SITUATIONS AND ENVIRONMENTS—

These are just a few of the character traits Casper Police Officer Randi Garrett developed during her time at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming.

As a kindergartner, Officer Garrett learned to play basketball through joining a Boys & Girls Clubs' team. She continued to play with the Club until sixth grade. In addition, Officer Garrett attended the Club after school and during the summer. She enjoyed going to the gym, the art room, and learning to play pool at the Club. "There was always something to do," she said. She credits the Club with helping her overcome her shyness. "Being at the Boys & Girls Club with all the different kids with different ages, it helped you not be so shy. As a police officer, you're talking to all different kinds of people from all walks of life, like you do at the Boys & Girls Club. Every call you go on, you're meeting someone new."

Whether playing basketball or getting along with the other kids at the Club, being a Club kid helped Officer Garrett develop the team work skills she uses every day as a police officer.

"Cop work is a lot of team work. You're not just one person. You have dispatchers, your sergeant, all the people that you work with, day-in and day-out, that make your job possible. If you get in a bad situation, you're relying on that person next to you to help you out."

As she grew, Officer Garrett developed the leadership skills that she uses daily as a police officer by helping younger students at the Club. Now, as a School Resource Officer at a local high school, Officer Garrett continues to mentor younger students.

“Then, I was an older elementary kid talking to younger elementary kids, helping them with their homework, or problems, or bullying, or whatever it may be. What I do now as a cop, as a School Resource Officer, I’m talking to high school kids as an older adult, helping to guide them with how to get along with their parents...keeping kids on track to graduate.”

Officer Garrett knows firsthand the difference the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming made in her life. She believes the Club’s mission in other’s lives is unending and impactful:

“What they do for the community is great. There are a lot of kids who don’t have good homes to go to every night, or Mom and Dad work a lot. It gives them a good opportunity to stay busy and have a bunch of other kids and adults to look up to as mentors.”

We are grateful for the opportunity to have made a difference in Officer Garrett’s life, and we are thankful for the difference she continues to make in the lives of youth.

MENTORING-IN-ACTION

Youth of the Year finalist, Madilyn, has been a part of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming for nine years. “When I get asked the question of what the Club means to me, I’d have to say that it’s somewhere kids can go if they need help or social help, or help with school work, or anything. They know the Club is a safe spot for them, that the staff there are willing to work with them with whatever they need.”



Officer Garrett, who works at Madilyn’s high school, is a role model for Madilyn. “She is someone I can go to if I need help, whether it’s with a student, or if I know another student in this building needs help, I know that I can go to her. She goes out of her way and creates that positive foundation for these kids. I think that’s why I look up to her so much,” said Madilyn.



TERESA ISAIS, ENTREPRENEUR

For Teresa Isais, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming was more than a place to go after school or in the summer—it was her family. “It’s always been about family,” she said. “To me, that was the best part of my childhood, because I built these strong friendships that, even into adulthood, are a phone call away.”

Teresa says her role models at the Club, Chad and Kim Sharpe—former Director of the North Casper Club—provided her with a solid foundation for making good decisions and correcting bad ones.

Now, as a college graduate and small business owner, Teresa credits the Club with giving her the tools to be successful in life. While she struggled with a reading disability during her school years, she turned to trusted Club staff—rather than her teachers—for help. “I would take all my homework to the Boys & Girls Club and sit and be tutored by them. I just never knew I would be a college student. The tools that I learned at the Club enabled me to go to college and graduate—with not one associates degree, but two!”

For Teresa, the unstoppable mission of the Club continues in her life now that she’s a mother. Paralleling her own experience, her daughters are discovering a safe place where they can build friendships and make wise choices.

“I view the staff as my co-parent in raising [my kids] because what I can’t give them, they do,” Teresa said. She is grateful for the Club’s impact in her life as an alumni, business owner and single-parent.



NICK HILL, CEO, CASPER QDOBA



It was from the Boys & Girls Club that Nick Hill—CEO of Casper Qdoba restaurants—developed the social skills, confidence and character needed throughout his career as a food-and-beverage industry leader.

Nick became a member of the Club in its early days when it was known as the Casper Boys Club. His father helped start the Boys & Girls Club in Evansville, where Nick fondly remembers spending time boxing. Growing up, playing sports at the Club gave him confidence.

Throughout Nick's life, he has made a difference in other's lives. He has served as a Specialist in the Army, worked for celebrity chefs, managed and helped start hotels, coached his daughter's soccer teams, and eventually, opened the Casper Qdoba stores. But the unstoppable Mission of the Club has been with him since he first joined the Club as a young child. After his parents separated when he was in 1st grade, financial troubles for his single mother often meant he and his brother didn't have enough to eat. His teachers couldn't figure out why he struggled in school during the morning hours but was attentive after lunch. Because of his experience not eating breakfast before school, and knowing firsthand how that negatively impacted his learning, Nick's goal has always been to make sure kids (and others) have enough to eat. He demonstrates both philanthropy and hospitality by making sure the homeless, veterans, elderly and youth are fed.

"Anything I can do in the community—I never say no to any organization that is a non-profit that needs help. I may not always be able to sign a check and send it to the organization, but I can help with donating food. I can help with some of those other things. I try to find a way of how I can help."

Nick credits his military background, his "little Greek mother," and the Boys & Girls Club of Central Wyoming with shaping him into the man he is today. More than half of the people who have impacted his life have had some affiliation with a Boys & Girls Club. Nick also appreciates the affordable quality after-school programs the Club provides, which helped his family and countless other working parents. The Club enabled Nick, in his own words, to "become something bigger in life," and for that, he is grateful.



PEDRO MENDEZ, TECH COORDINATOR SUSIE McMURRY TECHNOLOGY CENTER

For nearly three decades, Pedro Mendez—Tech Coordinator and Assistant Director of the Main Branch—has been a superhero in his own right at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming.

Having joined the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming when he was five years old, he credits the Club with having a positive impact in his life. “I had friends that were always on the street, doing stuff they shouldn’t have been—smoking, drinking at a young age. Just being at the Club got me away from that environment.”

When Pedro was 11 years old, he met his real-life superhero, Club CEO Ashley Bright. “Ashley stepped into the door and seeing him work all the time, and doing what he did, inspired me,” Pedro said. “That’s what I wanted to do, I wanted to inspire kids myself.” Ashley’s example inspired Pedro to aim high—his goal is to one day become a CEO of a Boys & Girls Club.

Pedro’s passion for technology first began years ago as a youth at the Club, learning how to use computers and software programs. He now teaches youth how to use the various technology available in the recently expanded Susie McMurry Technology Center, from Photoshop, to a video editor, or SketchUp—a 3D design software that enables kids to build homes or cars—and more.

Just as he was inspired by Ashley Bright’s example, he serves as an example for today’s youth. “I do hear it out there once in a while—‘If it wasn’t for Pedro, I wouldn’t be who I am today,’” he said. He is honored to hear the impact he’s made in helping Club youth find

their career paths.

Being an inspiring example is all in a day’s work for Pedro:

“I show up to work every day to see these kids’ faces and make a difference.” He is motivated by watching them grow and progress in character and leadership.

“We introduce kids into all these fun activities, programs and sports. Without having that, they wouldn’t have a safe place to go. They wouldn’t learn how to play a sport or how to use technology, or [receive] that homework help that kids really do need.”

Pedro’s mission is unstoppable—he wants youth to discover their own super powers. **“I JUST WANT THEM TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN LIFE AND [FIND] SOMETHING THAT THEY’RE PASSIONATE ABOUT.”** Pedro feels each Club kid is a superhero just by being who they are.



SUSIE McMURRY TECHNOLOGY CENTER UPDATE

The addition of the Susie McMurry Technology Center allowed the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming to improve from a high-quality computer lab to an innovative Technology Center.

The addition took technology programming to an unbelievably high level. It is roughly twice the size of the space, and the Club has doubled the number of computers.

OVERALL THIS PROJECT HAS NOT ONLY ENABLED US TO SERVE YOUTH MORE EFFECTIVELY THAN EVER, BUT IT HAS HELPED RECRUIT MORE YOUTH TO OUR PROGRAM.

The larger space allowed us to expand our offerings with new technology, like our innovative Private Label Virtual Reality Booths and Google Expeditions. **Many Club members said that the Tech Center was their favorite part of the Club!**

Central Wyoming Youth of the Year, Julie Dysart, said Pedro was **“the most influential staff member in her life.”**



WHAT'S NEXT:

Our next phases of the project will be to add a Makerspace and a Media Center. A Makerspace would give our Club members a hands-on learning approach to design and create in order to prepare for the workforce and to help solve real-world problems.

The Media Center would allow Club members to explore their creativity and learn job skills in the ever growing media world. Club members could create their own newscast, web design, movies, and more.

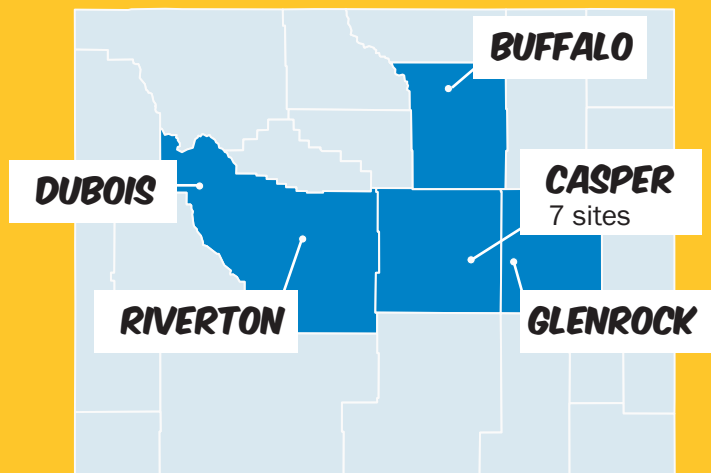

providing after school and out-of-school care at 11 Club sites in four counties. Youth have access to growth opportunities, high yield learning activities, and relationship building focused on three priority outcomes: Academic Success, Healthy Lifestyles, and Good Character and Citizenship.

Daily targeted programs like Power Hour assist Club members in completing homework and extends their school-day learning into the hands-on, experiential culture of the Club. Healthy Habits and SMART Moves help young people make healthy choices for their lives, not just in what they eat or how they stay physically healthy, but also their social interactions and self-image. Programs such as Cowboy Ethics challenge youth to find their foundational values and live them in all of their endeavors.

A brand new Boys & Girls Club located inside Rendezvous Elementary opened on August 23, 2021. The Club serves all youth, notwithstanding their families' financial situation, and provides a safe, engaging place for kids in kindergarten through 5th grade. August – Teen Social In an effort to combat juvenile crime by providing a positive alternative for teens, "Teen Social at the Station" began in August 2021, and was held on four consecutive Thursday nights from 7-10p.m. Over 750 teens showed up during "Teen Social at the Station" for games, free food, and a grand prize drawing for a new electric bike. The Mayor and the Chief of Police both reported that the objective the Club and community hoped for was accomplished: positive relations with teens, no violence, and fun for everyone. Teen Social continued into the fall of 2021 with "Teen Late Night," to offer teens fun activities on Friday nights into the winter months.



YOUTH OF THE YEAR

Jinnie Ponder, a junior at Roosevelt High School, was named the Wyoming Youth of the Year on April 6, 2021, in a virtual ceremony from Cheyenne. She received a full-tuition and fees scholarship (supplement to the Hathaway) from the University of Wyoming. She also received a \$2,500 award from Boys & Girls Clubs of America Youth of the Year sponsors.

“The Club is where I started to grow from the wallflower I once was and began to socialize with the staff and my peers,” said Jinnie, who has been a Club member for eight years. “I never realized I was part of something so big, until I noticed the little differences I was making in others’ lives.”

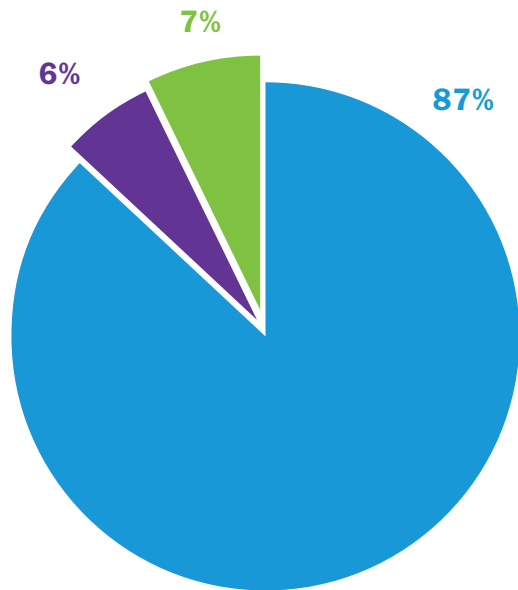

Since 1947, Youth of the Year has been Boys & Girls Clubs of America’s premier recognition program, celebrating the extraordinary achievements of Club members.

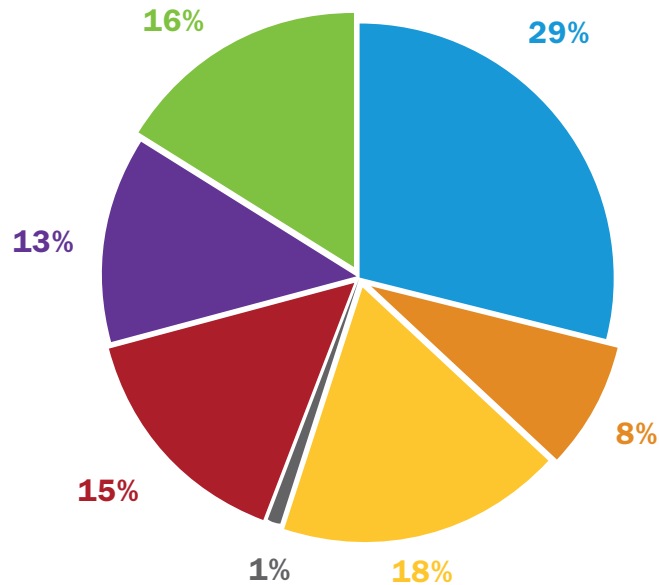

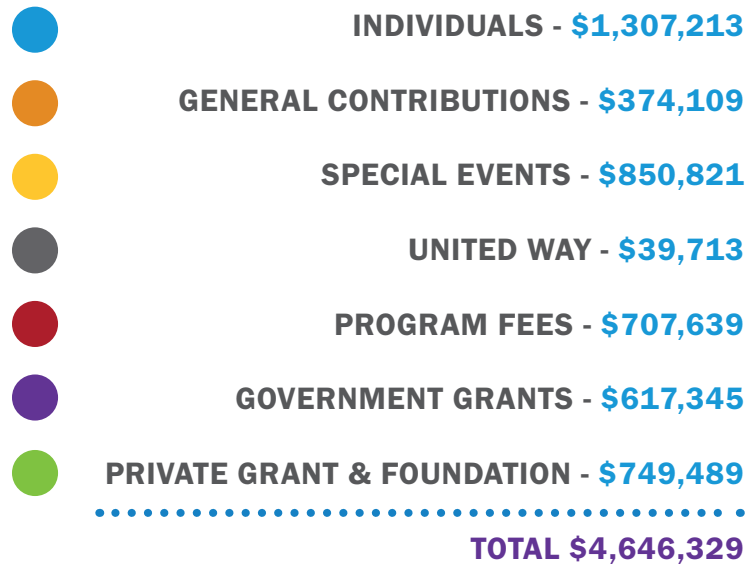
