



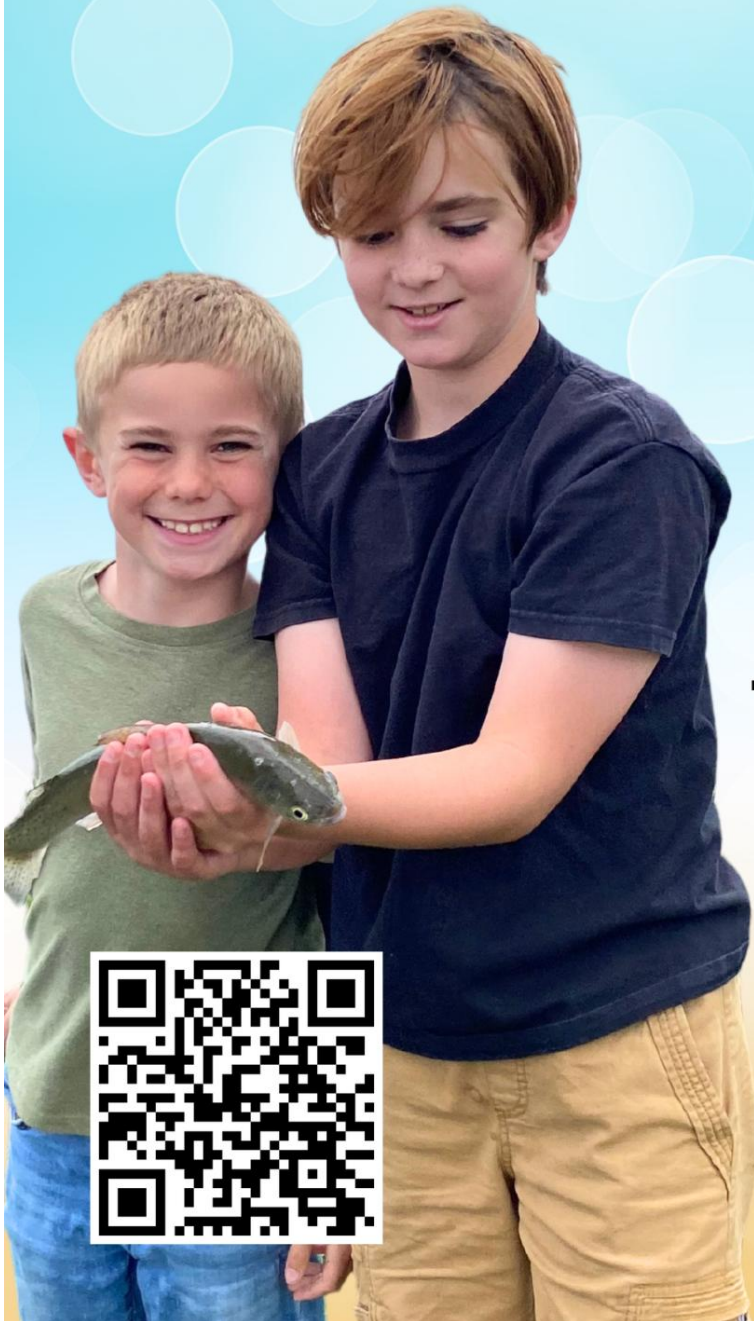

For the safety of your child, a parent or guardian **MUST** accompany all camp participants into and out of the Club each day. DO NOT park or drop off children along the sidewalk or bus lanes. Park in designated parking spots at all sites.

Welcome to the Boys & Girls Club 2025 Summer Programming!

Welcome to a new summer with the Boys & Girls Club of Dubois! It is our pleasure to serve your children. Our summer will be full of fun and excitement! This packet provides important information about our policies. Our staff is looking forward to providing the best experience for your child this summer. Your assistance will help us achieve this.

Available Sites

Dubois Club

Ages Served

Dubois serves members ages 5-18

Children MUST have completed kindergarten and have not yet graduated from high school.

Hours/Late Fees

7:45 am – 5:00 pm

Any child not picked up by closing time, 5:00 pm, will be charged a late fee of \$1 for every additional minute he/she is left at the Club. This fee must be paid before the member is allowed to return to the program. If your child is left for more than one hour past closing, the proper authorities will be notified.

Schedules

The Dubois Club will be closed June 2 – June 6 and Aug. 11 – Aug. 18, 2025 for Club maintenance. All sites will be closed on July 4 in observance of Independence Day.

Field trips will be offered at all sites. These trips may include the library, movies, museums, nature walks, water days, swimming and much more! Nominal fees may be required for some field trips. Please contact your site for scheduling and fee information.

Drop-off /Pick-up

Upon arrival and departure to and from Clubs, parents/guardians must come in to check in and check out with a staff member. Please park in designated parking spots. **DO NOT park along the sidewalk/bus lane at any location.** This is for the safety of our members, families, and guests.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming is a drop-in facility and has an open-door policy where members are advised to stay on Club premises; however, we cannot legally require a member to stay at the Club. Staff does not grant permission to leave nor do we insist that children stay. Arrival and departure is a matter strictly between parent/guardian and the child(ren). We will, however, be monitoring the entrance of the building. As always, safety for our members is our top priority. If you have a specific concern, please notify the Site Director.

Payment/Weekly Balances

The summer camp fee is \$12 per child per week. A payment of \$12 is required the Friday before the week your child is expected to attend.

In order for your child to attend any camp week, full payment must be received NO LATER than the Monday morning of that week. Lack of payment will result in your child(ren) not being able to attend any Club that week.

Refund Policy

If a child is unable to attend camp, **no refund will be given for the annual \$10 membership fee.** No refund will be given if a child is removed from the camp in the event of disciplinary actions. A \$30 processing fee will be applied to any applicable refund.

Discipline

The goal of our summer program is to provide members with an atmosphere of fun, creativity, and respect through meaningful supervised experiences, which will encourage positive personal development. Please feel free to speak with the Site Director about our discipline policy. Your cooperation will assist us in achieving these goals.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming enforces the following codes of conduct:

1. Respect for self, other members, staff, and property.
2. Threats, violence, and foul language will not be tolerated.

The Boys & Girls Clubs staff is instructed to take the following disciplinary actions:

1. Verbal warning, time outs, Club service.
2. Parental notification. It is at the discretion of the Site Director to give suspensions.
3. Dismissal from all Boys & Girls Clubs summer sites.
4. Fighting is an automatic two-day suspension.

Sick Policy

No child will be admitted to camp if any of the following conditions are present:

1. A contagious disease (i.e. COVID-19, chicken pox, cold/flu, etc.).
2. Any fever over 100 degrees; must be fever free for more than 24 hours.
3. Excessive sneezing or coughing.
4. Signs of vomiting and/or diarrhea.

A child will be sent home if any of the above conditions occur at Club. There is a space provided on the membership application for alternate emergency phone numbers. Sick children must be picked up within one hour. There will be a \$5 charge for every 10 minutes past one hour that the member is left at the facility.

Medication

If your child requires medication, we prefer it is taken outside of Club hours. If it is necessary to bring medication to the Club, *for the safety of all*, please alert the Site Director to discuss a secure location to keep the medication while your child is at the Club. However, our policies do not allow for staff to administer medication so it will be your child's responsibility to remember to administer the medicine him/herself.

Personal Items

We encourage your child to bring only the necessities to the Club, as there will be no locked storage available. If your child decides to bring personal items, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Wyoming/NCSD#1 will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items. Children are discouraged from bringing cell phones, tablets, or any other gaming devices to the Clubs!

We do, however, encourage you to send your child(ren) with a **hat, sunscreen, water bottle, and closed-toe shoes.**

Lunch/Snacks

Your child will be provided a healthy morning snack and afternoon snack. **Please pack a lunch for your child.**
